PRESENTATION LEGAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

Mr. Jim Magazine with Lucas Magazine Law Office, spoke to Fiscal Court on regarding the opioid epidemic throughout the state of Kentucky. Mr. Magazine presented Fiscal Court with a Legal Services Agreement, which would allow the County to hold such persons or entities responsible for irresponsible distribution of prescription medications. County Attorney John Wooldridge advised Fiscal Court not to enter into this agreement at this time, as his office has not reviewed the Service Agreement presented.

SHEPHERDSVILLE POOL SUPERINTENDENT KEITH DAVIS

Bullitt County Superintendent Keith Davis, spoke to Fiscal Court reading the Shepherdsville Pool, inquiring what Fiscal Courts intentions where. If Fiscal Court has no intention of repairing the Shepherdsville Pool, Mr. Davis expressed that facility could be used by Bullitt Central High School athletics department, or another program within the school. County Attorney John Wooldridge informed Fiscal Court that the current agreement between Bullitt County Fiscal Court and the State, ties Fiscal Court to the pool. If Fiscal Court determines the Shepherdsville pool will not be reopened, both the County and the School Board will need to request relief from the current agreement from the State. Using the pool or pool facilities for anything other than specified in the original agreement would be in violation of the signed agreement.

JUDICIAL CENTER NEW HIRE

On motion of Judge Roberts, seconded by Esq. Mitchell, with Fiscal Court having concurred, hiring Ms. Katie Terrell as a part time, as needed custodian at the Judicial Center, at a rate of \$12.50 per hour and no benefits.

COURT HOUSE NEW HIRE

On motion of Judge Roberts, seconded by Esq. Mitchell, with Fiscal Court having concurred, hiring Ms. Heather Thomas as a part time, as needed custodian at the Court House, at a rate of \$12.50 per hour and no benefits.

ANIMAL SHELTER
DISCUSSION

Discussion was had amongst Fiscal Court and audience members regarding the current status of the Director at the Animal Shelter. It was noted that the Judge Executives office received a letter from Mr. Williams Doctor, stating he will be able to return to work on October 15, 2017. County Attorney John Wooldridge stated there are other requirements the county is requiring of Mr. Williams before he will be allowed to return to work. The county has the option to fill the position of Animal Control Officer/Director at any time.

BULLITT COUNTY EXTENSION DISTRICT 2017-2018 BUDGET AND 2017 TAX RATE

Mr. David Puckett presented to Fiscal Court the 2017 Bullitt County Extension Board Tax Rate, showing a real estate Rate of 0.989%, Mr. Puckett also presented the 2017-2018 County Cooperative Extension Service Budget Plan. Fiscal Court accepts the Tax Rate and Budget, and enters them into the record.

ORDINANCE 17-23: SECOND READING
REPEALING ORD. 13-17 DEPUTY SHERIFF MERIT BOARD

A second reading on Ordinance 17-23, an Ordinance repealing 13-17, relating to the creation, operation, and authority of a Deputy Sheriff Merit Board was given by Assistant County Attorney, Rob Flaherty. Sheriff Donnie Tinnell spoke, stating he took a poll within his office, an over 95% of his staff were not in favor of repealing the Merit Board. Esq. Rayhill question if the current Merit Board could be amended? Per KRS 70.267 the statute will not allow for the current Merit Board to be amended, allowing a deputy to run for Sheriff while employed through the Sheriff's office.

On motion of Esq. Rayhill, seconded by Esq. Mitchell, with Fiscal Court having concurred, directing Fiscal Court not to adopt Ordinance 17-23, an Ordinance repealing 13-17, relating to the creation, operation, and authority of a Deputy Sheriff Merit Board.

PLANNING AND ZONING SPECTRUM INTERENT SERVICE

CHAPEZE LANE DESIGNATED SCENIC BYPASS

Discussion was had regarding the possibility of turning Chapeze Lane into a Scenic Bypass. County Attorney John Wooldridge, and Planning and Zoning Director Flecia Harper addresses questions and comments.
