Over the years some confusion has occurred over the appointment of members of EDA. The confusion has been caused by the resignation of board members, late appointments, and incorrect dates on letters of appointment.

We as a board, in order to get back in compliance with our bylaws, would like to correct this issue by suggesting that the following changes be made which would mean members would serve (4) years, terms would be staggered with (2) members being appointed every year, and no members appointed in the 4^{\oplus} year. In that regard, we would like to adjust the appointments with your approval as follows:

The expiration term of Chairman Jessica Sullivan would be changed from June 30, 2019 to March 31, 2019.

The expiration term of Treasurer Mark Stout would be March 31, 2019.

The expiration term of Director Frank Ragg would be changed from March 1, 2020 to March 31, 2020.

The expiration term of Director Paul Ham would be changed from March 1, 2020 to March 31, 2020.

The expiration term of Vice Chairman Kenny Hester would be changed from March 30, 2022 to March 31, 2021.

The expiration term of Director Lisa Lewis would be changed from March 1, 2021 to March 31, 2021.

This follows as close as possible to the appointments which the Fiscal Court and EDA offices have on file.

Further, we have (2) seats on the board which are up for reappointment on March 31, 2019. These seats are held by Mark Stout and Jessica Sullivan, both of which desire to be reappointed. These appointments would be held until March 31, 2023.

COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY BULLITT COUNTY FISCAL COURT RESOLUTION 19-06 PROVIDING FOR GRADING OF PUBLIC ROADS

WHEREAS, Bullitt County Fiscal Court is required shall accepts roadways into the County Road System for perpetual maintenance if the roadway meets standards set forth by County Ordinance; and.

WHEREAS, Bullitt Fiscal Court finds and determines that roads that are not now maintained as a county road because the roads do not meet the minimum standards to be accepted for perpetual maintenance as a county road, but do serve the public and should be improved for public safety and the county can expend non road aid funds to do so.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Bullitt County Judge Executive shall have the authority to direct the Bullitt County Road department to grade any public road that is in need of same upon the request of the magistrate whose district encompasses the road after the magistrate has certified that he or she has personally inspected the road and that the public safety, ie, school buses, police, fire and ambulance service would be improved by the grading and the county attorney has verified that the road is a public, not private road.

This Resolution having been adopted by the Fiscal Court of Bullitt County, Kentucky during a Regular Meeting this 2^{nd} day of April, 2019 by a vote of 2^{nd} . For; 2^{nd} Against; and 2^{nd} Abstentions.
