




It is hereby moved that the Bullitt County Clerk be allowed to expend the total sum of \$1,788,420.00 for the operation of the office during the calendar year 2020.

2020 ANNUAL ORDER SETTING MAXIMUM AMOUNT FOR DEPUTIES AND ASSISTANTS

Pursuant to KRS 64.530(3), "...The Fiscal Court shall fix annually the maximum amount, including fringe benefits, which the officer may expend for deputies and assistants...". SECTION 9.400 OF THE OFFICIAL ZONING REGULATIONS OF
BULLITT COUNTY AND ALL CITIES WITHIN ITS BOUNDARIES**

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court of Bullitt County has the authority pursuant to Section 9.400 of the Official Zoning Regulations of Bullitt County and all Cities within its Boundaries to establish a Schedule of Fees, Charges and Expenses; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court has considered the evidence of the public hearing held by the Bullitt County Joint Planning Commission and the favorable recommendation of the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court concurs in and adopts the reasons of the Planning Commission for an Amendment to the Schedule of Fees, Charges and Expenses and approves and accepts the favorable recommendation of the Planning Commission in this matter as set out in said minutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF THE COUNTY OF BULLITT, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

SECTION ONE: The Fiscal Court adopts and approves of the Amendment to the Schedule of Fees, Charges and Expenses as set forth in the attached Fee Schedule, which is adopted in its entirety and is incorporated by reference herein.

SECTION TWO: The Fiscal Court, pursuant to Section 9.400 of the Official Zoning Regulations, shall have the right to establish a Schedule of Fees, Charges and Expenses by Resolution from this point forward. Said Schedule shall be provided to the Administrative Official of Planning and Zoning for posting and publication as necessary to advise and inform the public.


SECTION THREE: The rest and remainder of Section 9.400 of the Official Zoning Regulations not amended herein shall not be affected by this Ordinance and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION FOUR: Should any section, subdivision, sentence or clause of this Ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, then such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holdings shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION FIVE: This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication.



The minimum fee for review and inspection under this section shall be \$285.00.

Change in Use (Occupancy Type): Plan review and inspection fees for buildings in which the Use or Occupancy type is changed shall be calculated in accordance with the fee schedule using the total square footage of the entire building or structure under the new occupancy type as determined by the outside dimensions of the building. The minimum fee for review and inspection under this section shall be \$285.00.

Alterations and Repairs: Plan review and inspection fees for alterations and repairs not otherwise covered by the fee schedule shall be calculated by multiplying the total area being repaired or altered by the cost per square foot of each occupancy as listed in the fee schedule. The total square footage shall be determined by the outside dimensions of the area being altered or repaired. The minimum fee for review and inspection under this section shall be \$285.00.

Special Fees: In addition to the others fees described, Special Fees shall be applied for the specialized plan reviews and inspections of the following specialized systems:

1. Fire Detection System (Fire Alarm): The fee for zero to 20,000 square feet shall be \$275.00; over 20,000 square feet shall be \$275.00 plus \$30.00 for each additional 10,000 square feet in excess of 20,000 square feet.

ANNOUNCEMENTS


Magistrate Logsdon stated that they are looking into making Bullitt County a Second Amendment Sanctuary. It is being discussed and looking into the next steps of the process.

Magistrate Rayhill also stated that he loves his rights, as well as Bullitt County citizens, and the Court will do whatever they can do to keep them.


Judge Summers thanked citizens for coming to the meeting and encouraged people to vote at the Special Election.
