Judge Summers called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. and welcomed everyone. All magistrates were present. Councilwoman Bonnie Enlow gave the invocation and led the pledge to the flag.

BULLITT COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT
COVID-19 UPDATE

Director Andrea Renfrow gave a brief update on the COVID-19 issue in Bullitt County. She stated that the symptoms are flu like and can take 5 to 14 days to show such symptoms. She stated that there are 24 cases in 7 counties within Kentucky. There are no confirmed cases in Bullitt County yet, but some

in neighboring counties. She stated that we all need to follow the precautions such as washing hands, avoiding crowds, and disinfecting. Several companies are now developing testing kits to make them more available to the public. Discussion was had amongst Magistrates, Sheriff Sholar, Judge Summers, and Director Andrea Renfrow.

DEPUTY OF THE MONTH

Sheriff Sholar gave a brief update about the Sheriff's Office. He stated that they are only making priority call runs, and doing reports over the phone to limit exposure. He stated that Dispatch is asking questions about homes, before dispatching calls as well. He stated that they will be monitoring and enforcing the Governor's orders on restaurants, bars, and price gouging.

Sheriff Sholar introduced Detectives Dale Presley, Floyd Cook, and Mona Sullivan as Deputies of the Month. Mona was unable to be present, but Sheriff Sholar stated that they have all done outstanding work for a number of years and aided in finding a criminal in another state.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CHANGING OF ZONING OF CERTAIN PROPERTY FROM AGRICULTURAL TO R-1 RESIDENTIAL. THE PROPERTY IN QUESTION IS 1.269 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, LOCATED AT A PORTION OF 670 LIGHT LANE, IN AN UNINCORPORATED AREA OF THE COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court of Bullitt County has considered the evidence of the public hearing held by the Planning Commission and the recommendations of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court concurs in and adopts the reasons of the Planning Commission for said zoning change and approves and accepts the recommendations of the Planning Commission in this matter as set out in said minutes; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF COUNTY OF BULLITT, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

SECTION ONE: That the above property located in the unincorporated area of Bullitt County and more particularly described in the minutes and records of the Planning Commission in Docket Number 2020Z-01 is hereby changed from Agricultural to R-1 Residential.

SECTION TWO: This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication.

SECTION THREE: Should any section, provision or part of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.





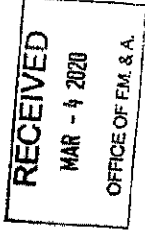

ORDINANCE 20-02; SECOND READING
AMENDING ORD 00-15
INSURANCE PREMIUM SURCHARGE

Assistant County Attorney Rob Flaherty, read the second reading of Ordinance 20-02, an Ordinance amending Ordinance 00-15 and reaffirming and imposing license fee on Insurance Companies (Insurance Premium Surcharge) engaged in the business of insurance within Bullitt County. The first reading was held on March 3, 2020.

Members of the court spoke about Ordinance 20-02 to the public that was present. Magistrate Mitchell stated that he has seen this done in the past, and the county lost every dime to the cities. He stated that he spoke to many people and it would increase the taxes substantially. He does not support this Ordinance, and cannot support putting more tax on the people. Magistrate Logsdon stated that he has reached out to his community and most people feel like they are already paying a lot of taxes. He understands that very little of that actually goes to the county, but he hasn't had ample time to look into other avenues such as an occupational tax. He believes that additional revenue is needed, but something that cities cannot turn around and take from the county. Magistrate Laswell said that he hates to see more taxes, but the county needs more money. He stated that if the county does not get more money, then when you call 911 service, an ambulance will not be available to respond and he does not want this county as a whole to suffer. He stated with the new retirement system hitting the county, they simply have no choice. Magistrate Rayhill stated that his job is to protect the people and this county in any means necessary. He said that his own taxes will increase substantially as well, but this is the only way to keep the county running properly. Discussion was had amongst Magistrates, Judge Summers, and County Attorney John Wooldridge regarding the cities taking the increase of taxes for themselves, but there is no way to legally prohibit this action.

**COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY
BULLITT COUNTY
ORDINANCE NO. 20-02**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 00-15 and REAFFIRMING AND IMPOSING A LICENSE FEE ON INSURANCE COMPANIES ("INSURANCE PREMIUM SURCHARGE") ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS OF INSURANCE WITHIN BULLITT COUNTY.

WHEREAS, The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky allows fiscal courts to impose license fees on insurance companies within their respective counties; and,

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court of Bullitt County previously determined that the imposition of such fees (insurance premiums surcharge) will further the health, safety, welfare and convenience of the residents of this county,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Fiscal Court of the County of Bullitt, Commonwealth of Kentucky, as follows:

Section 1: It is hereby imposed on each insurance company a license fee for the privilege of engaging in the business of insurance within Bullitt County, Kentucky, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and thereafter on a calendar year basis.

Section 2: The license fee imposed on each insurance company which issues any insurance policy, which is not a health or life insurance policy, shall be Ten (10%) percent of the premium actually collected within each calendar quarter by reason of the issuance of such policies on the risk located within Bullitt County on those classes of business which such company is authorized to transact, less all premiums returned to policy holders; however, any license fee imposed upon premium receipts shall not include premiums received for insuring employers against liability for personal injuries to their employees, or death caused thereby, under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act and shall not include premiums from policies of health or life insurance.

Section 3: The revenue derived from the license fees herein levied shall be paid into and become a part of the general fund of the county and paid to the county Treasurer and shall be paid at the address indicated in the insurance premium license fee return no later than 30 days after the end of the calendar quarter. License fees not paid to the Treasurer in the manner prescribed on or before the due date shall bear interest at the rate defined in KRS 131.183.

Section 4: Every insurance company subject to the license fees imposed by this Ordinance shall annually, by March 30, furnish to the Bullitt County Treasurer at the address indicated in the insurance premium license fee return a written breakdown of all

collections in the preceding calendar year for the following categories of insurance: (a) casualty; (b) automobile; (c) Inland Marine; (d) fire and all perils.

Section 5: The Clerk of the Bullitt County Fiscal Court is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Ordinance and any future amendment thereof, or any amendment of any section thereof, to the Commissioner of Insurance, Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Section 6: This Ordinance shall take effect on July 1, 2020

Section 7: All ordinances and resolutions, to the extent they are inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

They have very limited masks at the moment. He stated that they have to call hospitals ahead of time to tell them what their situation is, but currently there are no cases in Bullitt County. He stated that some members of the community are having a hard time getting water, so they have been filling up jugs for people if it is needed and will continue to do so. ORDINANCE 20-03; FIRST READING
HEARING BOARD FOR TOW LOT

Assistant County Attorney Rob Flaherty read the First Reading of Ordinance 20-03, relating to the creation of a hearing board pursuant to KRS 70.155 to hear challenges to the validity of motor vehicle impoundments by the Bullitt County Sheriff. The second reading will be held at the next Fiscal Court meeting on April 7, 2020.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Magistrate Mitchell thanked previous Magistrate Gary Lawson for coming to the meeting. He also suggested that the county should look into having the debt of the county refinanced.

Magistrate Logsdon stated that he will soon give a Proclamation to Bullitt East Cheer and Eastside Middle Cheer and proclaiming March 23rd as Cheer Day.

Magistrate Rayhill encouraged people to check on their families and individuals who cannot help themselves during this time.

Judge Summers stated that times are tough and they have to address this regionally because every community is in it by their self.

County Clerk Kevin Mooney stated that the Clerk's Office has recently closed to public, but are still open for mail, online renewals, phone calls, etc. He also stated that the Governor has postponed the election by 35 days, which took some pressure off of the office and elderly poll workers.

Administrator Depp Rasner stated that the Property Valuation Office is also closed to the public, but most of the work can still be processed.


SURPLUS PROPERTY

On motion of Esq. Rayhill, seconded by Esq. Logsdon, with Fiscal Court having concurred, to authorize the County Attorney to appoint an appraiser to look into surplus property that the county owns.

Vote: Unanimous for—motion carried.
