

REGULAR SESSION BULLITT COUNTY FISCAL COURT
HELD ON TUESDAY APRIL 21, 2020, AT 9:30 A.M.

Judge Summers called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. and welcomed everyone. This meeting was held via Zoom Video Communications due to the Coronavirus Epidemic. All magistrates were present. Father Terry Langford, of St. Aloysius of Shepherdsville, gave the invocation and led the pledge to the flag.

FISCAL COURT BILLS APPROVED

Open Invoice Reports from the Judge/Executive's Office dated through April 16, 2020 had been submitted for Fiscal Court's review and approval and copies are on file in the County Clerk's Office. Disbursements from each fund totaled: #01- \$156,449.86; #02- \$102,167.52; #03- \$97,529.35; #04- \$1,034.84; #09- \$44,114.87; #77- \$16,689.88. Grand total disbursements from all funds: \$417,986.32.

On motion of Esq. Laswell, seconded by Esq. Logsdon, with Fiscal Court having concurred, the claims referenced above totaling \$417,986.32 were approved as presented and were ordered to be paid.

COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY
COUNTY OF BULLITT
ORDINANCE NO. 20-03

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CREATION OF A HEARING BOARD PURSUANT TO KRS 70.155 TO HEAR CHALLENGES TO THE VALIDITY OF MOTOR VEHICLE IMPOUNDMENTS BY THE BULLITT COUNTY SHERIFF

WHEREAS, KRS 70.155 permits the Bullitt County Sheriff to impound certain motor vehicles and impose applicable fees under the conditions set out therein; and

WHEREAS, KRS 70.155 requires the creation of a Hearing Board by Ordinance to hear challenges to the validity of motor vehicle impoundments by the Bullitt County Sheriff; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court of Bullitt County desires to create such a Hearing Board in accordance with the provisions of KRS 70.155.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF COUNTY OF BULLITT, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

SECTION ONE: That a Hearing Board is hereby established pursuant to the provisions of KRS 70.155 to hear challenges to the validity of motor vehicle impoundments by the Bullitt County Sheriff. The Hearing Board shall be composed of three (3) members appointed by the Bullitt County Judge/Executive, subject to the approval of the Bullitt County Fiscal Court. Each member shall be at least twenty one (21) years old and a resident of Bullitt County, Kentucky. The initial terms of the members shall be staggered with one being two (2) years, one being three (3) years, and one being four (4) years. All subsequent appointments shall be for a term of four (4) years.

SECTION TWO: The Hearing Board shall meet as necessary to hear challenges to the validity of motor vehicle impoundments by the Bullitt County Sheriff and shall conduct its hearings consistent with the provisions of KRS 70.155. At its first meeting, the Hearing Board shall appoint a Chairperson and a Secretary from its members. The Chairperson shall preside over the hearings, and the Secretary shall be responsible for keeping minutes of the proceedings. The Hearing Board may request the Office of the Bullitt County Judge/Executive provide staff to assist with administrative needs and recordkeeping. All official records of hearings of the Hearing Board shall be submitted to and maintained by the Office of the Bullitt County Clerk. Any expenses of the Hearing Board for operations or administration shall be paid from the funds received by the Bullitt County Sheriff from the impoundment of motor vehicles.

SECTION THREE: Any appeal from a determination of the Hearing Board may be made to the Bullitt District Court within seven (7) days of the Hearing Board's determination in accordance with KRS 70.155(5)(e).

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication.

SECTION FIVE: Should any section, provision or part of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.





ANNOUNCEMENTS


