COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY COUNTY OF BULLITT ZONING ORDINANCE NO. 19-14

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CHANGING OF ZONING OF CERTAIN PROPERTY FROM R-1 RESIDENTIAL TO AGRICULTURAL. THE PROPERTY IN QUESTION IS 3.22 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, LOCATED AT 4069 KNOB CREEK ROAD, IN AN UNINCORPORATED AREA OF THE COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court of Bullitt County has considered the evidence of the public hearing held by the Planning Commission and the recommendations of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court concurs in and adopts the reasons of the Planning Commission for said zoning change and approves and accepts the recommendations of the Planning Commission in this matter as set out in said minutes; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF COUNTY OF BULLITT, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

SECTION ONE: That the above property located in the unincorporated area of Bullitt County and more particularly described in the minutes and records of the Planning Commission in Docket Number 2019Z-18 is hereby changed from R-1 Residential to Agricultural.

SECTION TWO: This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication.

SECTION THREE: Should any section, provision or part of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

Judge Summers said that they will speak to the County Attorney to see how this process works and will get back to him.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Magistrate Rayhill spoke to Fiscal Court about the issues arising over the pipelines coming to the county. He stated that he reached out to several individuals to look into this issue and they do not have the authority to pull the permits from LG&E. He stated that the court has the right to help people, but does not have the right to spend money on this issue. He does not want to spend money on a lawsuit, without proof of wrongdoing if they are not guaranteed to win.

Judge Summers stated that the Fiscal Court body is not a court of law and no court has deemed anything LG&E has done is illegal. He also invited everyone to attend the Bullitt County Fair this week and the Hillview Fair this weekend. He also wanted to thank Emergency Management Services for getting to seven running ambulances and a projected nine ambulances by next year.
