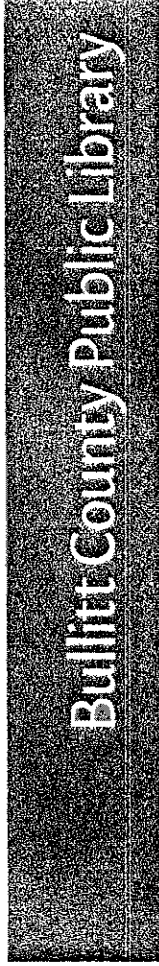
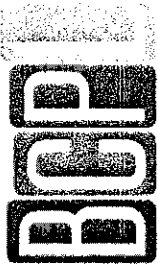
MINUTES APPROVED

PRESENTATION BULLITT COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY TAX RATE 2020

Bullitt County Public Library Director Joe Schweiss presented the 2020 Public library Tax Rate to Fiscal Court. He stated that the tax rate was reduced overall, and held at 6.2 cents per \$100.00 on Real Property and Personal Property and 2.12 cents per \$100.00 on Motor Vehicle.

The Bullitt County Public Library Board of Trustees has elected to take the compensating tax rate for the fiscal year 2020-21, as provided by the Kentucky Department for Libraries and Archives and the Kentucky Department of Revenue, which lowers both our Real Property rate to 6.2 cents per \$100 of property value and our Personal Property tax rate to 6.2 cents per \$100 of property value. We foresee a small increase in revenue from last year which will help us in our first full year of operating the new Nichols branch.

Key moments from last year:

- We opened the Nichols branch and provided service to a new part of the county.
- Completed the designs for a new central library in Shepherdsville that will help meet community needs for decades to come.
- Until the pandemic, our checkouts for the year were on track to match those of last year while library visits were on track to increase by over 9,000 people.
- Modified our service model to provide valuable services while still keeping staff and patrons safe and healthy.
- Added technology to allow for self-checkout inside our buildings and 24-hour material checkout at two locations, both useful during a pandemic.

Our rates will comprise the following:

Real Property – 6.2 cents per \$100, more than two cents below the state average and down .2 cents from last year.

Personal Property – 6.2 cents per \$100, more than five cents below the state average and down .37 cents from last year.

Motor Vehicle – 2.12 cents per \$100, more than a cent below the state average

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CHANGING OF ZONING OF CERTAIN PROPERTY FROM AGRICULTURAL TO R-1 RESIDENTIAL. THE PROPERTY IN QUESTION IS 9.46 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, LOCATED AT 686 ALPAR LANE, IN AN UNINCORPORATED AREA OF THE COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court of Bullitt County has considered the evidence of the public hearing held by the Joint Planning Commission and the recommendations of the Commission, the information provided in the Staff Report of the Office of Bullitt County Planning and Zoning, and the testimony and evidence presented at the public hearing held by the Fiscal Court; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court concurs in and adopts the reasons of the Joint Planning Commission for said zoning change and approves and accepts the recommendations of the Planning Commission in this matter as set out in said minutes and determines that the proposed zoning change is acceptable and should be approved; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF COUNTY OF BULLITT, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

SECTION ONE: That the above property located in the unincorporated area of Bullitt County and more particularly described in the minutes and records of the Planning Commission in Docket Number 2020Z-13 is hereby changed from Agricultural to R-1 Residential.

SECTION TWO: This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

SECTION THREE: Should any section, provision or part of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION FOUR: All ordinances and resolutions, to the extent they are inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.



SPEAKER
ANIMAL CONTROL DIRECTOR

Norman Quartermouse spoke to Fiscal Court about the issues he is having with Director Greenup of the Bullitt County Animal Shelter. He would like to see her removed from office because she has stolen people's dogs. He had an incident at his home that consisted of her removing several animals and having them spayed and neutered. He stated that he had no trespassing signs and she violated them.

Perry Robertson spoke to court about the termination of Director Greenup. He stated that he has dealt with her for three years and has removed his dogs on three different occasions. He stated that recently she has taken several hunting dogs from a friend and want to see them returned. Discussion was had amongst the Court, County Attorney John Wooldridge, Assistant County Attorney Rob Flaherty, and Perry Robertson. They stated that this is now a District Court decision and those dogs were taken due to poor living conditions.

Ron Chandler stated that he has also had dealings with Director Greenup and is not happy with the results. She has taken his dog and has stolen his shock collars. He believes she strives to take hunting dogs.

SPEAKER
DUMP TRUCKS ON BROOKS HILL ROAD

Rod Leading spoke to Fiscal Court about the dump trucks constantly driving on Brooks Hill Road. He stated that the road is getting worse and will require major work. He asked the court not to rezone the property to commercial because he fears for the safety of the people in the area.

Mr. Becker brought some video in to show the court regarding the dump trucks on Brooks Hill Road. He showed the volume of trucks on the road as well as the damage being done. He stated they are not stopping after dark and continue to cross over the yellow lines.

LIGHT PROVISIONS

Wanda Stafford spoke to Fiscal Court about the lighting issues near her home. She brought photos for the court and has reached out to the neighbors to see if they can turn down the light and they have refused. Her HOA has also put up LED lights in her neighborhood that she does not want. She has added trees to her yard and has tried to block the windows, but she has fallen three times from being blinded by these lights. She is asking the court for help with this issue. Discussion was had amongst the Court and County Attorney John Wooldridge. Mr. Wooldridge stated that this is private property that they cannot regulate, but she could speak with the HOA about her concerns. He also stated that he will look into other cities' ordinances to see what could be applicable to Bullitt County.

EXECUTIVE SESSION CONVENED
