AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF
BULLITT COUNTY FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021/2022

BE IT ORDAINED by the Fiscal Court of County of Bullitt, Commonwealth of Kentucky:

SUMMARY

WHEREAS, the proposed budget was tentatively approved by the Fiscal Court of Bullitt County on the 4th day of May, 2021, and approved as to form and classification by the State Local Finance Officer.

SECTION ONE

The following budget is adopted for the Fiscal Year 2021/2022 and the amounts stated are appropriated for the purposes indicated in the summary analysis set forth hereafter.

CLERK'S OFFICE
ELECTION EQUIPMENT DISCUSSION

County Clerk Kevin Mooney spoke to Fiscal Court about the Board of Elections asking for new voting machines. He stated that he can reduce the voting locations to reduce labor costs and printing costs of ballots. He is asking Fiscal Court to reserve a line item in the upcoming 2021-2022 Budget for \$600,000.00. Judge Summers stated that there is currently a line item with \$643,000.00 that is the money provided by the Clerk's Office for future building acquisition. Judge Summers said the funds can be used toward voting machine upgrade expenses, and will be replaced at a later date. Kevin also expressed his concerns on expansion and/or building a new facility in the new future. He stated that he is at full capacity, and Judge Summers assured him that the Clerk's Office will get funding.

Judge Summers thanked Deputy Judge Kay Parrish, Chief Financial Officer Keith Griffiee, and Secretary Lora Padgett for all their hard work on the 2021-2022 Fiscal Court Budget. He also thanked Rob Flaherty for his services over the years and looks forward to working with him as the new County Attorney.


Magistrate Mitchell stated that he is happy to have the Budget done and for all the hard work.

Magistrate Logsdon, Laswell, and Rayhill all congratulated Rob Flaherty on his new position as County Attorney.


Rob Flaherty thanked the Judge for his confidence in appointing him and all the Magistrates for their support.
