**A RESOLUTION CONTINUING THE NATIONAL
INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS)**

WHEREAS, the President, in Homeland Security Presidential Directive (HSPD)-5, directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State, local and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to, and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size, or complexity; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky has established the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the State standard for incident management; and

WHEREAS, the Incident Command System components of NIMS are already an integral part of various incident management activities throughout the State, including current emergency management training programs, the County Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) pursuant to KRS 39A.230 (2) (a) and (b); and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that all Federal, State, and local emergency agencies and personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management; and

WHEREAS, to facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management, it is critical that Federal, State, and local organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structures, inter-operable communications, consolidated actions plans, unified command structures, uniform personnel qualifications standards, uniform standards for planning, training, and exercising, comprehensive resource management, and designated incident facilities during emergencies or disasters; and

WHEREAS, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities and resources will improve the county's ability to utilize federal and state funding to enhance local and state agency readiness, maintain first responder safety, and streamline incident management processes; and

WHEREAS, the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks (9-11 Commission)

recommended adoption of a standardized Incident Command System; and

WHEREAS, Bullitt County Fiscal Court previously passed Resolution Number 5-20 on October 4, 2005, adopting NIMS;

**SHERIFF'S OFFICE
2020 COUNTY TAX SETTLEMENT**

SECTION 5: All response agencies and organizations of Bullitt County shall continue to exercise plans and procedures in the application of the Incident Command System.


SECTION 6: All response agencies and organizations of Bullitt County shall continue to utilize Incident Command System pursuant to KRS 39A.230 (2) (a) and (b); and Homeland Security Presidential Directive (HSPD) - 5.

SECTION 7: All response agencies and organizations of Bullitt County shall continue to utilize the Incident Command System as identified in the Bullitt County Emergency Operations Plan Direction and Control and Incident Management System Operating Procedures when responding to some of day-to-day, routine emergency incidents and multi-agency or multi-jurisdictional emergency, declared emergency, disaster or catastrophe.

SECTION 8: All response agencies and organizations of Bullitt County shall continue to be compliant in the National Incident Management System by participating in the National Incident Management System Capability Assessment Support Tool.


