Judge Summers called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. and welcomed everyone. All magistrates were present. Chaplain Joe Wells, of Zoneton fire Protection District, gave the invocation and led the pledge to the flag.

TREASURER'S TRANSFER REPORT

ROGERS ROAD DISCUSSION

Stephen, a constituent from the area, informed the court about the issues arising when this happens. He stated that the road is too narrow for a semi to get through and not run another vehicle off of the road. He stated that a GPS will bring drivers down their road as a shortcut when Interstate 65 is backed up. He is asking for the court to put a sign up stating that no tractor trailers are allowed down Rogers Lane. County Attorney Rob Flaherty stated that the county can put a sign up and also ask the Sheriff's Office to come out and monitor if the situation arises.
