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# SAFE STREETS ACTION PROPOSAL FEDERAL GRANT

Chief Financial Officer, Keith Griffee, also a representative of KIPDA presented the Safe Streets Action Proposal to the Court. He gave a presentation with the requirements to apply for the Safe Streets Grant with the Federal Government. We will apply as a region, and this grant will allow funding to take care of the most dangerous roadways in the County. Jefferson County has already entered into this grant and will be assisting the County with the processes. There are several things that the county must present in order to submit an application for this grant; consisting of identifying the most dangerous locations based on analysis of existing conditions and historical trends, identifying the most dangerous locations based on systemic factors, and identifying a comprehensive set of projects and strategies to address the


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safety issues. The County will need to invest \$12,287.41 to \$20,000.00 for this action plan. This grant will be five billion dollars over five years, starting with \$1 billion in 2022-2023 Fiscal Year. Keith Griffee suggests that the County invest in this grant to secure the roadway funding for our County.

On motion of Esq. Logsdon, seconded by Esq. Mitchell, with Fiscal Court having concurred, to approve the Safe Streets Action Proposal with a maximum of \$20,000.00 investment.

### ROAD DEPARTMENT **EQUIPMENT PURCHASE**

### SPEAKER WEIGHT LIMIT

Buddy Shepherd asked the Court what they could do about the weight limit on Mount Eden Road. He said military vehicles are driving over the weight limit, but the Court stated that is a State Law and monitored by DOT. Rob Flaherty, County Attorney, stated that trucks are able to run overweight, but must put up a security bond for damages. The military is not exempt from following the weight limit set by the State, unless they secure a bond.
