They are working to correct the discrepancy and will have more monetary changes at the next Fiscal Court meeting on January 16.

On motion of Judge Summers, seconded by Esq. Logsdon, with Fiscal Court having concurred, to increase Deputy Director Rebekah Osman's salary to \$68,500.00, and to change the Training Director's, Sharon Shofner, hourly rate to annual salary of \$67,750.00.
