Judge Summers called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and welcomed everyone. All Magistrates were present. Pastor Tim Miller, of Faith Assembly of God Lebanon Junction, gave the invocation and led the pledge to the flag.

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#### TREASURER'S TRANSFER REPORT

Transfers: Expenditures by Date from the Treasurer's Office dated through February 5, 2024 has been submitted for Fiscal Court's review and approval. Copies are on file in the County Clerk's Office.

On motion by Esq. Logsdon, seconded by Esq. Sanders, with Fiscal Court having concurred, accepting the Transfers: Expenditures by Date Report as presented.

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#### FISCAL COURT BILLS APPROVED

Open Invoice Reports from the Judge/Executive's Office dated through February 5, 2024 had been submitted for Fiscal Court's review and approval and copies are on file in the County Clerk's Office. Disbursements from each fund totaled: #01- \$ 269,352.56; #02- \$ 17,801.15; #03- \$ 117,787.14; #09- \$ 37,486.73; #77- \$ 13,251.85. Grand total disbursements from all funds: \$ 455,679.43.

On motion of Esq. Sanders, seconded by Esq. Johnson, with Fiscal Court having concurred, the claims referenced above totaling \$ 455,679.43 were approved as presented and were ordered to be paid.

On motion of Esq. Bleemel, seconded by Esq. Sanders, and Fiscal Court having agreed to dispense with the formal reading, the minutes of the regular session of Bullitt County Fiscal Court held on Tuesday, February 20, 2024, were approved as presented and the Judge was authorized to sign same.

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#### SPEAKERS

##### HWY 44 W WATER

Jennifer Stefano spoke to the Court about her residence on Highway 44 West that is still without a water main. Her family has to haul water to her residence, but Louisville Water is putting a line a mile down the road. She would like for the Court to see how the neighboring residences could connect to that water line. There are no fire hydrants near her residence, and this would allow for them in case of an emergency. Judge Summers stated that he will put her on the Louisville Water List for unserved areas.

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SPEAKER  
ANIMAL SHELTER

Theresa Clifford spoke to the Court regarding her concerns over the Bullitt County Animal Shelter. She would like to see more transparency at the shelter, and more options for volunteers. The shelter has been full, and there are volunteers available to help with rescues or fostering, but the shelter lacks communication. She has frequent encounters with animals that are dumped near her residence and stated that the shelter is not very helpful. She would like the shelter to be more volunteer friendly and be more forthcoming with their influx of animals and who are at risk.

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SPEAKER  
ANIMAL SHELTER

Kristin Aubry spoke to the Court regarding her concerns for the Bullitt County Animal Shelter. She has worked with shelters and rescues for several years and understand that sometimes euthanasia is inevitable, but would like for there to be more communication with which animals are at risk. She would like to see more social media posts that she can share with her contacts to get these animals the help they need.

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SPEAKER  
ANIMAL SHELTER

Tamara Tinnell stated that she has been in contact with the Animal Shelter for a risk animal that she was trying to adopt. All of her family met with this animal, except her husband, and the Animal Shelter did not keep her updated on the status of her application, which was ultimately denied. Fortunately, other volunteers helped her with her request and the animal is now at her home, and has not showed any signs of aggression towards anyone. She would like for the process to deem an animal aggressive should be a collected effort of several members of the shelter.

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SPEAKER  
HIGHWAY 44 W WATER

Carol Mills spoke to the court regarding the need for city water near her home. Their current water supply is well water, and they have to filter the water two or three times to drink it. She is requesting the Court to look into this matter, since Louisville Water is putting a line in a mile from her residence. There are eight homes near her, that do not have any fire protection from water hydrants.

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PRESENTATION  
DIGITAL AIR-GROUND INTEGRATION RANGE

Fort Knox Commander Colonel, Chris Ricci, gave the Court an update on the new Digital Air-Ground Integration Range. He stated that this new development is on the Yano Range in Bullitt County, and this is a revolutionary advancement that is only one of two in the United States. This will serve different forces of the military and allow for training of all facets. This is a 56-million-dollar project and will have more aviation use, and multi vehicle training. He wants to keep the surrounding areas informed about the training schedules and when to expect an uptick in noise levels. Team Knox is thankful for good communication and understanding from the general public. They will have final testing in May, and their first unit is booked for September of 2024.

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SOIL CONSERVATION

Director Bill Harned presented the Court with the Soil Conservation 2024-2025 Budget. He stated that it is very similar to last year, and he can answer any questions.


ANNOUNCEMENTS


