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## PRESENTATION EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

Director Warren, and John Waters gave an updated Emergency Management Agency presentation. They stated that they have over sixty-four hours of training all over the state. They have created a Search and Rescue Team that consists of 15 members from across the County, that get together for a monthly training. They assisted Trimble County last month after a round of tornadoes. They are also responsible for maintaining thirty-six tornado sirens and making sure they are all in working order in case of an emergency. They also report numbers and various incidents to the State and have received over \$491,500.00 of Grant Funding over the last four years. They also aid in hosting Red Cross Blood Drives in the County. They are happy with their updated renovations of the Emergency Operations Center.

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## PRESENTATION TURN AROUND CENTER UPDATE

Jennie Mannes, Director of Turn Around Center, gave an update to the Court. She thanked the Court for all their support over the years and gave each member a folder full of information. She went over last year's statistics that consisted of serving 80,000 people with over 80 volunteers. They are dedicated to helping people turn their life around and help people from all over the county and neighboring counties. She believes they have grown because they are open to everyone with no boundaries. They have expanded to five buildings now, including a new Edith's Inn, formally known as Turnaround Inn. This aides in housing uprooted individuals for 90 days to create a healthier lifestyle. She encouraged everyone to come take a look at what is happening in Lebanon Junction and to come volunteer their time and expertise.
