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**SPEAKER**  
**MARK12 MINISTRIES**

Perry Cooke, with Mark12 Ministries, expressed his concerns over the heat wave that is hitting Bullitt County in the coming days. Has the Court considered opening a cooling station for the homeless and elderly in the area? They are getting calls everyday about air conditioners going out, and they lack the transportation to get all the individuals to the public libraries. Judge Summers stated that they have done things such as this in the past and will get with Emergency Management Agency to see what the plan of action is.

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**SPEAKER**  
**ACCIDENT ON INTERSTATE**

Robin Gehlbach expressed her heartache over the man who lost his life by hitting a stationary semi on a ramp here in Bullitt County. She stated that she spoke on this matter before in Court and expressed the danger of allowing this. Magistrate Logsdon stated that it is an Interstate, and they have no control over this, therefore the Court is not responsible for this tragedy. Robin asked the Court to do something and advocate for the safety of the public. She also questioned the Comprehensive Plan that was published. She asked if they could make the map bigger, so they could gain a better understanding to give their input on the matter.

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**PRESENTATION**  
**WINDSTREAM UPDATE**

Local Operation Manager of Windstream gave an update to the Court about the 45 projects coming to Bullitt County. He stated that 29 Projects have been started and are at a 71% completion. There have been 5,000 households served with Windstream Fiber. They are excited about this partnership and appreciate the opportunity to serve Bullitt County.

ORDINANCE #24-12

County Attorney Tammy Baker gave the second reading of the following zoning ordinance that was given first reading on June 4, 2024.

- Ordinance #24-12; Docket #2024Z-15; Kenneth Schell—an ordinance changing the zoning from R-1 Residential, Agricultural, and Stream Reserve to B-1 Highway Business. The property in question is 62.53 acres, more or less, located at Foster Lane, Parcel 054-000-00-074, in an unincorporated area of the county.

Logsdon, with Fiscal Court having concurred, and with the recommendation of the Planning Commission, Ordinance #24-1, Docket #2023Z-01 was adopted as presented and recorded below and the Judge was authorized to sign the same, with the following restrictions, but with the following restrictions: be used for paintball facility only, property cannot be subdivided for other commercial tracts, 20 acres +/- of woods in the northern flood plain area remain undeveloped with soft trails only, east/west netted area must have 100 foot natural vegetation buffer, hours of operation Monday through Friday does not begin prior to 9:00 am, landscaping with a berm be added to the KY 44 road frontage, 15 feet of ROW dedicated for future expansion of KY 44, turning lanes or acceleration/deceleration lanes be added to KY 44 per KYTC requirements unless not approved by KYTC, primary parking lot shall be asphalt with overflow lot being gravel, and one 28 foot centrally located access drive with two (left and right) exit lanes.

**WHEREAS**, the Fiscal Court concurs in and adopts the reasons of the Joint Planning Commission for said zoning change and approves and accepts the recommendations of the Planning Commission in this matter as set out in said minutes and determines that the proposed zoning change is acceptable and should be approved; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF COUNTY OF BULLITT, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:**

**SECTION ONE:** That the above property located in the unincorporated area of Bullitt County and more particularly described in the minutes and records of the Planning Commission in Docket Number 2024Z-15 is hereby changed from R-1 Residential, Agricultural, and Stream Reserve to B-1 Highway Business.


**SECTION TWO:** This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

**SECTION THREE:** Should any section, provision or part of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION FOUR:** All ordinances and resolutions, to the extent they are inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.



Judge stated that they will work on a pay scale for Emergency Medical Service. He stated that it is a competitive marketplace right now to retain employees.


