HELD ON TUESDAY, MARCH 4, 2025, AT 6:30 P.M.

Judge Summers called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and welcomed everyone. All Magistrates were present. Pastor Tim Miller, of Faith Assembly of God in Lebanon Junction, gave the invocation and led the pledge to the flag.

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MINUTES APPROVED

On motion of Esq. Logsdon, seconded by Esq. Johnson, and Fiscal Court having agreed to dispense with the formal reading, the minutes of the regular session of Bullitt County Fiscal Court held on Tuesday, February 18, 2025, were approved as presented and the Judge was authorized to sign same.

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TREASURER'S TRANSFER REPORT

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FISCAL COURT BILLS APPROVED

Open Invoice Reports from the Judge/Executive's Office dated through March 4, 2025 had been submitted for Fiscal Court's review and approval and copies are on file in the County Clerk's Office. Disbursements from each fund totaled: #01- \$34,4271.00; #02- \$49,406.92; #03- \$102,550.05; #09- \$96,406.87; #77- \$6,500.75. Grand total disbursements from all funds: \$599,135.59.

Director Rob Flaherty presented the Bullitt County Health Department's tax rate of 2.4 percent to the Court. It has remained the same for the last 15 or 20 years. He also invited the Court to the ribbon cutting of the new Mobile Unit on March 19, 2025 at 9:30 A.M.

RESOLUTION OF BULLITT COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH  
ESTABLISHING PUBLIC HEALTH TAX RATE IN THE YEAR OF 2025,  
FOR BULLITT COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH TAXING DISTRICT  
CREATED BY KRS 212.750

The BULLITT County Board of Health met on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of FEBRUARY, 2025, at SHEPHERDSVILLE, Kentucky.

On motion by CASEY LEWIS, duly recorded by ROBERT MCDADE, and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, a public health taxing district for BULLITT County, Kentucky, was established pursuant to the provisions of KRS 212.750 and;

WHEREAS, the members of the county or city-county board of health are by virtue of their office the governing body of the public health taxing district and are authorized to perform all duties attendant thereto in addition to their duties as members of the county or city-county board of health; and

WHEREAS, the other tax levying authorities within the taxing district have not in the opinion of this Board of Health appropriated an amount sufficient to meet the public health needs of the County Health Department nor an amount sufficient to meet the standards prescribed by the Cabinet for Health Services;

WHEREAS, the Cabinet for Health and Family Services normally approves all instances where the amount of local appropriation support for the BULLITT County Health Department meets the standards prescribed by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services pursuant to the provisions of 902 KAR 8:172 (10)1.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that there is hereby levied a special ad valorem tax upon all property subject to taxation in BULLITT County, Kentucky as provided by KRS 212.733 at the rate of 2.4 cents per \$100 of the assessed valuation of all real property and at the rate of 2.4 cents assessed valuation of all personal property; and at the rate of 2.4 cents per \$100 of the assessed valuation of all motor vehicles in BULLITT County as of January 1, 2025. The motor vehicle tax rate will be applicable to calendar year beginning January 1, 2026.

The fiscal court of BULLITT County, Kentucky, is hereby requested to levy such tax as set forth in the resolution which shall be in addition to all other county ad valorem taxes and to cause the same to be properly placed upon the tax bills of all taxpayers liable therefor by the proper county officers and to direct the sheriff of BULLITT County, Kentucky, to collect, receive and remit the proceeds of this levy to the BULLITT County Board of Health and to do any and all other things necessary, requisite and proper in the premises.

The secretary is directed to deliver a duly certified copy of this resolution to the fiscal court of BULLITT County.

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ANNOUNCEMENTS

Magistrate Bleemel spoke about the new House Bill regarding the Coroner's salary and wanted the Court to be aware. He also spoke about starting a Parks and Recreation Committee to collaborate with the cities in the County. Judge Summers stated that he has reached out to other surrounding counties to see how they handle the sports leagues, but those are normally handled by the cities. Discussion was had amongst members of the court regarding the type of Board needed to take on this task. Magistrate Bleemel also wanted to bring up Kinder Lane that donated a forty-foot right of way years ago, that was never recorded. The road is needing to be repaved but needs to be widened first.

On motion of Esq. Bleemel, seconded by Esq. Sanders, with Fiscal Court having concurred, to accept the forty-foot right of way on Kinder Lane and to have the road widened by the Bullitt County Road Department.

Vote: Unanimous for—motion carried.




