HWY 44 WEST

Linda Cole lives at 1900 Highway 44 West and came to Fiscal Court back in 2022 regarding a zoning change for a tiny home and RV park. She stated that she has invested \$20,000.00 on this venture and she has yet to open. She has had engineers on the property and has applied for permits and zoning requests but keeps getting the run around. Recently, due to a misunderstanding, her gravel driveway was taken out by the State, and she has no way to get work done on the property or have anybody stay on the property to make money. She stated that she is lost on how to proceed because her property is on both city and county property and may have to get an attorney. She has neighbors that are constantly in violations, but she feels that she is always the one getting attacked. Judge Summers stated that if your insurance is in the City of Shepherdsville, you must go through the City with these complaints. County Attorney Tammy Baker stated that obtaining an attorney is the right course of action for her at this point.

SPEAKER
HWY 44 WEST

Billy Shepherd expressed his frustrations over Highway 44 West needing to be fixed. He stated that the water company had to tear up some of the road to put a ditch in and has not fixed the road back to its previous state. Judge Summers stated that they are working with the State and waiting for permitting weather to get that fixed as soon as possible.

PRESENTATION FEMA UPDATE

Director Warren and Assistant Director Waters gave a brief presentation regarding the FEMA update relating to the flood on February 14, 2025. He stated that they are applying for FEMA funding reimbursements for three categories including Debris Cleanup, Emergency Protective Measures, and Roads/Bridges Repairs. They are hopeful to receive between \$500,000.00 to \$700,000.000 for FEMA reimbursements.

ZONING ORDINANCE: SECOND READING ORDINANCE #25-09

County Attorney Tammy Baker gave the second reading of the following zoning ordinance that was given first reading on March 4, 2025.

- Ordinance #25-09; Docket #2025Z-10; GRS Investments—an ordinance changing the zoning from R-1 Residential to I-L Light Industrial. The property in question is 2.227 acres, more or less, located at 116 Cabin Creek Drive, in an unincorporated area of the county.

ZONING ORDINANCE NO. 25-09

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CHANGING OF ZONING OF CERTAIN PROPERTY FROM R-1 RESIDENTIAL TO I-L LIGHT INDUSTRIAL. THE PROPERTY IN QUESTION IS 2.227 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, LOCATED AT 116 CABIN CREEK DRIVE, PARCEL NUMBER 035-NE0-02-015, IN AN UNINCORPORATED AREA OF THE COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court of Bullitt County has considered the evidence of the public hearing held by the Joint Planning Commission and the recommendations of the Commission, the information provided in the Staff Report of the Office of Bullitt County Planning and Zoning, and the testimony and evidence presented at the public hearing held by the Fiscal Court; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court concurs in and adopts the reasons of the Joint Planning Commission for said zoning change and approves and accepts the recommendations of the Planning Commission in this matter as set out in said minutes and determines that the proposed zoning change is acceptable and should be approved; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF COUNTY OF BULLITT, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

SECTION ONE: That the above property located in the unincorporated area of Bullitt County and more particularly described in the minutes and records of the Planning Commission in Docket Number 2025Z-10 is hereby changed from R-1 Residential to I-L Light Industrial.


SECTION TWO: This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

SECTION THREE: Should any section, provision or part of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION FOUR: All ordinances and resolutions, to the extent they are inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.





ANNOUNCEMENTS


Magistrate Sanders invited everyone out to the Health Department Mobile Clinic Ribbon Cutting on Wednesday, March 19 at 10:30 A.M.

Magistrate Logsdon wanted to thank Director Watkins for his quick response and hard work when receiving a call regarding a constituent's culvert issues.


