Judge Summers called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and welcomed everyone. All Magistrates were present. Magistrate Bleemel gave the invocation and led the pledge to the flag.

MINUTES APPROVED

On motion of Esq. Sanders, seconded by Esq. Logsdon, and Fiscal Court having agreed to dispense with the formal reading, the minutes of the regular session of Bullitt County Fiscal Court held on Tuesday, May 20, 2025, were approved as presented and the Judge was authorized to sign same.

TREASURER'S TRANSFER REPORT

PRESENTATION
RURAL SECONDARY ROAD PROGRAM
RESOLUTION 25-05

Tom Hall, from KYTC, spoke to the Court regarding the Rural Secondary Road Program. This program allows selected roads within the county to get resurfaced every year, and this year will be Deatsville Road from Highway 245 to Browningtown Road and Ridge Road from McCubbins Farm Lane to Greenwell Ford Road. The budget for these projects are \$1,282,280.00 with maintenance money coming off the top including equipment, flex funding, and County Judge Executive fees. Discussion was had regarding other roads that need to be considered in the future including Highway 44 W and Greenbriar Road.

On motion of Esq. Bleemel, seconded by Esq. Johnson, with Fiscal Court having concurred, to approve Resolution 25-05, indicating concurrence with the KYTC 2025-2026 Rural Secondary paving recommendations for Bullitt County, Kentucky as presented.




This Resolution shall stand as adopted by the Bullitt County Fiscal Court, and shall become effective upon passage and publication as required by law.

PRESENTATION
EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

Training Officer, Brandon Heming, gave a presentation on a new training program that they would like to bring to Bullitt County. There is a need to host the EMS-FTEP (Field Training and Evaluation Program) and could bring revenue back to EMS. There is an initial deposit of \$6,000.00 to secure the dates and instructor for the two classes, that could ultimately bring in revenue of \$4,375.00 after all seats are filled, and the rest of the \$7,000.00 is paid to the National EMS Management Association. The County will send 5 employees to the Field Training Officer Course, and 3 employees to the Managing and Evaluating Course. Each class has a maximum class size of 32 students, that they will fill the remainder with surrounding agencies purchasing a seat. Brandon Heming stated that this is only the beginning and this is a huge recruiting tool to get the County on the map in the EMS world. The \$6,000.00 is the next Fiscal Court Budget that begins July 1 and will be reimbursed when all seats are filled.

On motion of Esq. Logsdon, seconded by Esq. Johnson, with Fiscal Court having concurred, to accept the EMS-Field Training and Evaluation Program as presented, with a check payment of \$6,000.00 to be paid in the next Fiscal Court Budget beginning July 1, 2025.

CLEAN UP DAYS DUMPSTER

JUDICIAL CENTER
JANITORIAL STAFF

There were two bids presented for work and he suggests the bid with Covered Cleaning. This is a necessity and needed as soon as possible.

ANNUAL STANDING ORDER TO PRE-APPROVE CERTAIN RECURRING EXPENSES

Pursuant to KRS §68.275(3) "The fiscal court may adopt an order, to pre-approve the payment of monthly payroll and utility expenses; to make payments by means of electronic funds transfers; make technical changes; permit a standing order for county payments to include payments made to vendors regularly providing services to the county. No other expenses shall be pre-approved pursuant to this subsection without the written consent of the state local finance officer." The fiscal court of Bullitt County in accordance with state law hereby orders recurring expenses for payroll and utilities, vendors regularly providing services to the county, be paid when due.

The above standing orders shall expire after July 1 of each fiscal year and no more payments designated in the standing order shall be pre-approved unless a new order is adopted by fiscal court of Bullitt County according to the provisions of KRS §68.275(3).


SOUTHEAST FIRE PROTECTION BOARD


