**PRESENTATION**  
**FORCED WATER MAIN**

Director Christie Royalty-Orr gave a brief presentation on the Kentucky Division of Waste Management's forced water main on Collins Hill Road. She stated that this landfill has been closed since 1989 and sits on 25 acres. They have been working on making this operational for ten years, but due to the results of leachate, it has taken some time for the remediation process that will begin this year. A forced water main is currently being installed at the landfill on Collins Hill Road that will run along from Collins Hill Road to Belmont Road and onto Hwy 61 before tying into an existing sanitary sewer system at

the new Helen Hights Subdivision. These four miles of water main to pump the leachate down the system will cost approximately 3.1 million. Fiscal Court will only be responsible for project operations and long-term maintenance of the area, and for payment to the City of Shepherdsville for treatment of the leachate received through the force main.

#### ANNOUNCEMENTS

Magistrate Johnson stated that they received some bids for the restroom renovations at the Maryville Pool, but that is not what she is wanting to do at this time. The restrooms just need two doors installed and a sidewalk so they can utilize the restrooms during disc golf tournaments. Discussion was had and a new bid will be put in the paper for just the install of the doors and concrete walkway entrance.

Magistrate Bleemel stated that the Board of Parks and Recreation has now been created, and they need to get with members to see about availability. Keith Griffee would also like to get with the Board members for a meeting regarding a brownfield property in Pryor Valley that can be utilized.

Judge Summers stated that the City of Shepherdsville is attracting attention on Buckman Street and would like to see a decrease in the speed limit for safety concerns.

#### BUCKMAN STREET SPEED LIMIT DECREASE




There being no further business, on motion of Esq. Sanders, seconded by Judge Summers, and following a unanimous vote, the meeting adjourned at 10:18 a.m.
