MINUTES APPROVED

ZONING ORDINANCE: FIRST READING
ORDINANCE #25-20

A zoning ordinance for property owned by Ronald and Geri McCarthy, has been advertised for first reading and public hearing at this meeting. Planning and Zoning Director Charlie Spalding gave the following overview of the Planning Commission's hearing and recommendation on Docket #2025Z-35:

- Ordinance #25-20 Docket #2025Z-35; Ronald and Geri McCarthy—an ordinance changing the zoning from Agricultural to R-1 Residential. The property in question is 9.996 acres, more or less, located at 3776 Horsefly Hollow Road, in an unincorporated area of the county.

The Planning Commission recommended that the zoning change be approved based upon the fact that the requested zoning change is in agreement with the adopted Comprehensive Plan, with the following restrictions: Neither Tract 1 or Tract 1A may be further subdivided without approval by the planning commission and no street lighting on the frontage may be procured on the property itself or ROW.

County Attorney, Tammy Baker, gave the first reading, in summary, of Ordinance #25-20 for the record, and a copy is on file at the County Clerk's Office.



On Highway 245 from the intersection with Interstate 65 headed East to mile marker 5, speed limit to be changed from 65mph to 45mph.


On Highway 245 in the area of the School Zone for Bernheim Middle School, speed limit to be changed from 45mph to 35mph.



WHEREAS, it has been determined by Bullitt Fiscal Court that it is in the public interest that Bullitt County have its own dedicated Driver's License Program office; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by Bullitt Fiscal Court that the current system of Regional Driver's License Program offices has placed an undue burden on Bullitt County residents by forcing them to drive far distances out of our County, resulted in significant wait times and delays, and lead to widespread system outages; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Bullitt Fiscal Court that to further this goal, written correspondence be directed to the Governor's Office and the Offices of General Assembly leadership indicating such support.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Bullitt County Judge Executive is hereby authorized to direct correspondence to Governor Andy Beshear and all members of General Assembly leadership indicating Bullitt County Fiscal Court's support for ceasing implementation of the Regional Driver's License Program offices and reinstating County Driver's License offices.

This Resolution having been adopted by the Fiscal Court of Bullitt County, Kentucky during a Regular Meeting this 2nd day of September, 2025 by a vote of 4 For, 0 Against; and 0 Abstentions.


NEW HIRES


