SPEAKER
ROADWAYS

Richard Wise spoke to the Court regarding his concerns over weight limits on state roads in Bullitt County and the use by commercial vehicles. He would like the Court to restrict commercial vehicles on county roads. He also asked the Court to see if they could obtain the state portion of Old Preston Hwy from Marketplace Drive to the McDonalds, to close that access due to the number of accidents in that location. He is also concerned that the lack of signage near the two rock quarries and would like the State to put up Slow-Moving Truck signs to aid the drivers coming over the hill. Discussion was had regarding the legality of restricting commercial vehicle traffic on county roads.

ZONETON FIRE BOARD

Judge Summers acknowledged Dalen Thurow's 20 years of service on the Zoneton Fire District Board and thanked him for his service.

PRESENTATION
EROSION PREVENTION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL

Cade Bowen, with Lincoln Trail, gave a brief presentation on the erosion prevention efforts in the County. He stated that in 2025 they had 456 erosion inspections and conducted 27 ESPC/Drainage plan reviews. As of May 2026, they have conducted 138 inspections and have 44 active sites. The Court thanked him for his hard work and asked him for a current site list and his contact information.

PRESENTATION
DISC GOLF COURSE

Kim Foster, Director of Park and Recreation, informed the Court that the new disc golf course in Maryville had recently been ranked number ten in the state for 2026, out of 194 courses throughout Kentucky.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
COUNTY ROAD AID

Chief Financial Officer Keith Griffee asked the Court to approve the use of Local Government Economic Development and County Road Aid funds for use of public transportation, safety, and infrastructure.

On motion of Judge Summers, seconded by Esq. Johnson, with Fiscal Court having concurred, to use Local Government Economic Development and County Road Aid money to be used for the purpose of road needs throughout Bullitt County.

SPEAKER
TRUCKING TERMINAL

Rick Karschner spoke to the Court regarding his concerns over the trucking terminal off East Hebron Lane. He stated that they have had approximately 100-150 loads of dirt hauled off and don't know where it is going in the county. He does not believe they are following their permit conditions and is concerned about the dangerous roadways with these trucks on the road. He believes it is being covered up, not cleaned up properly.

ZONING ORDINANCE NO. 26-13

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CHANGING OF ZONING OF CERTAIN PROPERTY FROM B-1 HIGHWAY BUSINESS TO R-1 RESIDENTIAL. THE PROPERTY IN QUESTION IS .5 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, LOCATED AT 1600 GREENBRIAR ROAD, PARCEL NUMBER 070-000-03-077B IN AN UNINCORPORATED AREA OF THE COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court of Bullitt County has considered the evidence of the public hearing held by the Joint Planning Commission and the recommendations of the Commission, the information provided in the Staff Report of the Office of Bullitt County Planning and Zoning, and the testimony and evidence presented at the public hearing held by the Fiscal Court; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court concurs in and adopts the reasons of the Joint Planning Commission for said zoning change and approves and accepts the recommendations of the Planning Commission in this matter as set out in said minutes and determines that the proposed zoning change is acceptable and should be approved; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF COUNTY OF BULLITT, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

SECTION ONE: That the above property located in the unincorporated area of Bullitt County and more particularly described in the minutes and records of the Planning Commission in Docket Number 2026Z-23 is hereby changed from B-1 Highway Business to R-1 Residential.

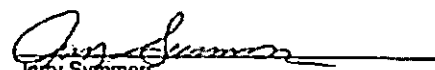
SECTION TWO: This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.
